



CALL FOR ABSTRACTS

POSTERS AND ORAL COMMUNICATION

THEMES

The 9th edition of EGEA invite the scientific communities, as well as all stakeholders interested in food and health issues, to jointly examine and address **the contribution of diet and specifically of fruit and vegetables to the One Health approach**. The aim is to illustrate with scientific evidence, how they contribute to individual health and the sustainability of food systems while exploring the role of the consumers in the vegetalization of their diet.

Therefore, the themes for abstracts submission are the following, considering that abstracts could abord different themes as One Health is the interconnection between different fields:

- Diet and fruit and vegetables and their contribution to:
 - o **human health** and wellbeing
 - o **food safety**
 - o **food security**
 - o **sustainability's** different dimensions: **environment** (climate, water, soil, biodiversity and ecosystem), **food waste and loss**, **economic**, **socio-cultural**, etc.
- The determinants of **consumer behaviour** and choice (food environment, social norms, marketing techniques, nudges, etc.)
- The role of **public policies to implement global responses to human and environmental health threats and to help bringing the production and consumption of fruit and vegetables into the "One Health" approach** (taxes and subsidies, labelling and claims, food aid programmes, etc)

GUIDELINES FOR ABSTRACTS SUBMISSION

The abstract should be:

- Based on recently published (2022-2023) or unpublished documents (to be precised at the top of the document with the link to the original publication if the article is published)
- Submitted as an attached Word document (one-page) to: egea@aprifel.com
- Written in English, with Arial font, size 10, line spacing 1.

Please download the template to submit your abstract. The template provided must be fully respected and the formatting must be kept.

Title: Use an initial capital letter only for the first word and for proper nouns, without abbreviations.

Author and Institution:

- All authors initials, surnames, institutions and countries should be listed. If there is more than one name and address, they should be related by subscript numbers in parentheses i.e. (1).
- Please precise the **name and e-mail address of the presenting author** with a *.
- The submitting author must declare any financial or other conflict of interest with a company related to the submitted work for all co-authors.

Text:

- **450 words maximum** excluding references clearly stating **objectives, methodology, results, and conclusion.**
- Tables, figures and graphs are not allowed.

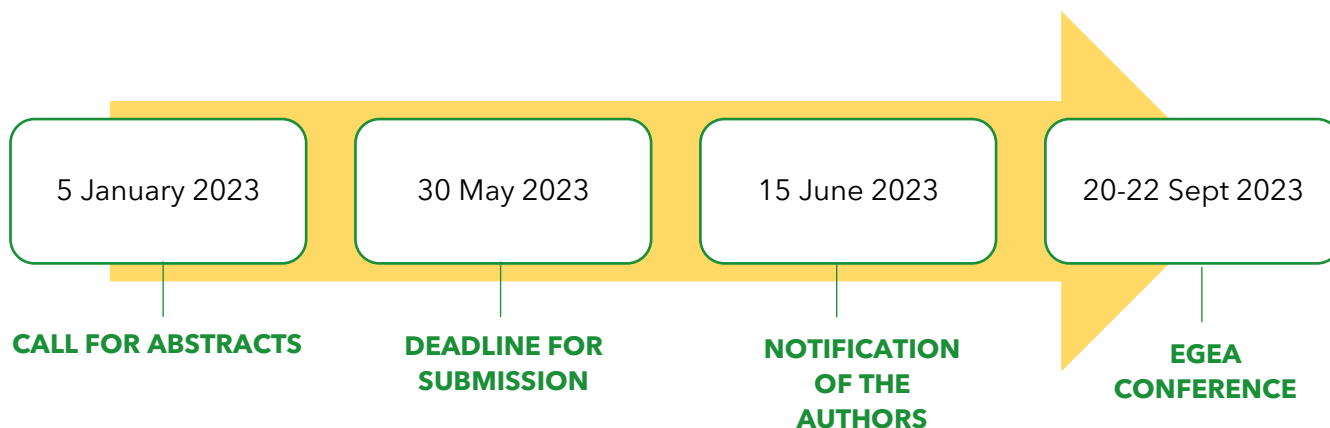
At the end of the document, authors should indicate:

- the theme(s) of the abstracts to ensure that submissions are reviewed by the appropriate expert from the scientific committee and,
- if they would like to present a poster and/or an oral communication to consider their preference when building the programme.

REVIEW PROCESS, TIMEFRAME, AND DEADLINE

Before being accepted for presentation, abstracts are reviewed first by an **editorial committee** and then by **two members of the scientific committee of EGEA** according to the theme(s).

Abstracts will be considered based on the **quality of the communication** in terms of its **relevance to the topics** of the conference, the **substance of its results**, and its **originality**.



Acceptance of an abstract for oral or poster communication implies that the presenting author will register for EGEA conference 2023 and present his/her paper at the conference.

As a reminder, oral and poster speakers will not be covered and will have to pay the registration fee. Once the abstract is accepted for poster presentation and/or oral communication, authors will receive a registration link with a preferential fee.
